



Rosman High School Alumni Hall of Fame



Purpose: The Rosman High School Alumni Hall of Fame is organized to recognize alumni who have achieved success and also the people who have contributed to our community. We created the Rosman High School Hall of Fame to improve the pride of our school and develop appreciation of others that have contributed. We hope to bring the relationship of our school and the community together as one.

Categories for the Alumni Hall of Fame: Individuals may be nominated in any of five categories: Public Service, Career Success, Athletic Achievements, Inspirational Experiences, and Contribution to RHS (anyone).

- **Public Service:** For those who have served in the Military or Government, or have extensive community involvement and service.
- **Career Success:** For those who have achieved success in a career, have served well in their career path, and/or those who have accumulated awards.
- **Athletic Achievements:** For long-standing record holders from Rosman High School or those who have achieved athletic success after high school.
- **Inspirational Experiences:** For people who have achieved and overcome obstacles throughout their lifetime such as fighting illness, overcoming debt, or leading someone to overcoming an obstacle, or served others through community service, all the while demonstrating Tiger Pride.
- **Contribution to RHS:** For people who have contributed to Rosman High School through time or money. Nominees for this category do not have to be RHS alumni.

Eligibility and Nomination Procedures:

- Alumni and faculty members of Rosman High School can be nominated for any of the above categories. Contributions to RHS is open to anyone.
- Once inducted, a person cannot be inducted into another category.
- Anyone can nominate a person, but a nomination form has to be filled out completely. A person cannot nominate him or herself.
- Nominees can be living or deceased.
- Nominees must consent to a background check and not be guilty of anything beyond minor traffic violations.
- The voting committee recognizes that there was a time when graduation from high school was not required and/or that personal obligations sometimes took priority, resulting in dropping out. However, many of these individuals have gone on to do great things for the community. Therefore, RHS students who dropped out before 1970 will be considered for induction.

Voting and Induction:

- The voting committee will consist of: RHS Student Body President or designee, a representative from the athletic boosters, an active Rosman community member, RMHS Yearbook Advisor, RHS Teacher, RHS Principal or retired principal, and three RHS students who fill out applications and return to the former committee to be voted upon.
- The voting committee members cannot nominate, nor can they vote on themselves or immediate family members if nominated.
- The number of inductees will be five a year; one from each category.

Recognition of Inductees:

- Inductees will be recognized at a home football game, will have their names placed on a plaque permanently displayed at RHS, and will be in that year's RMHS yearbook.

Appreciation: We would like to thank all of the individuals who have contributed in any way to our community or school. We would also like to thank the committee who will be choosing the nominations so that the Hall of Fame can become a tradition.
