1. Review and approve meeting minutes from last meeting on 10/13/20
 - a. Motion to approve by Sarah Gehan, seconded by Elizabeth Eaton, and all other members in favor
2. Proposal postponing School Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA)
 - a. Must include needs assessment, stakeholder involvement, goals, evidence-based strategies/actions/services, and proposed expenditures

- b. Every school in district is required to complete a plan with goal to improve student achievement
 - c. Propose to postpone the school site plan until new Strategic Plan and 3-year LCAP are developed in Spring 2020
 - d. School site still working on goals related to instruction, professional development, PLCs, student engagement, and SEL learning
 - e. Shanna Bengtson moved to postpone the SPSA until Strategic Plan is developed, seconded by Scott Church, and approved by all other site council members
3. Review Initial i-Ready data - Presented by Sonia Gomez
- a. Discussed how i-Ready data is used
 - b. Math and Reading levels shown by grade level and in comparison to other schools and districts
 - c. Diagnostic 2 Assessment scheduled for December
 - d. Data will be shared at conferences in January
4. Feedback/Comments
- a. Do students really need to take i-Ready three times per year or are two times sufficient?
 - i. Not sure, but parents are welcome to inform district of concerns
 - ii. When students make progress and see growth, they are so proud of themselves
 - iii. Used for class placement but maybe December scores can be used.
 - iv. Also used as data points for SST, 504, IEP meetings as well as support services, such as tutoring.
 - b. What information do teachers get from i-Ready and how is it helpful?
 - i. Domains covered, but don't see actual questions
 - ii. Teachers look at how students score as a class to drive curriculum and determine speed/scaffolding
 - iii. i-Ready can give lessons for students to reinforce their skills
 - iv. Students can be grouped in RTI and other classes based on their skills
 - v. If students in RTI aren't showing growth, another enrichment elective may be offered
