Fishbowl is a strategy for organizing medium- to large group discussions. Students are separated into an inner and outer circle. In the inner circle, or fishbowl

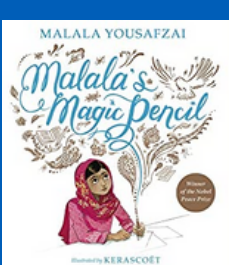
Essential Question or Problem

Teaching Strategy

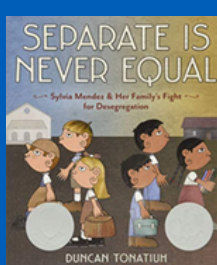
