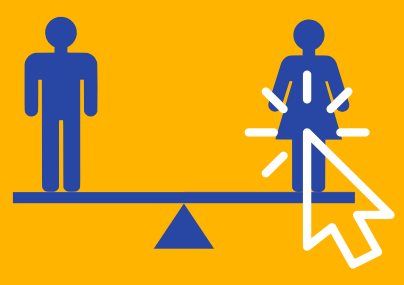

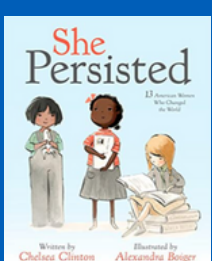
Essential Question or Problem
