- Exceeds the requirements-=3 points

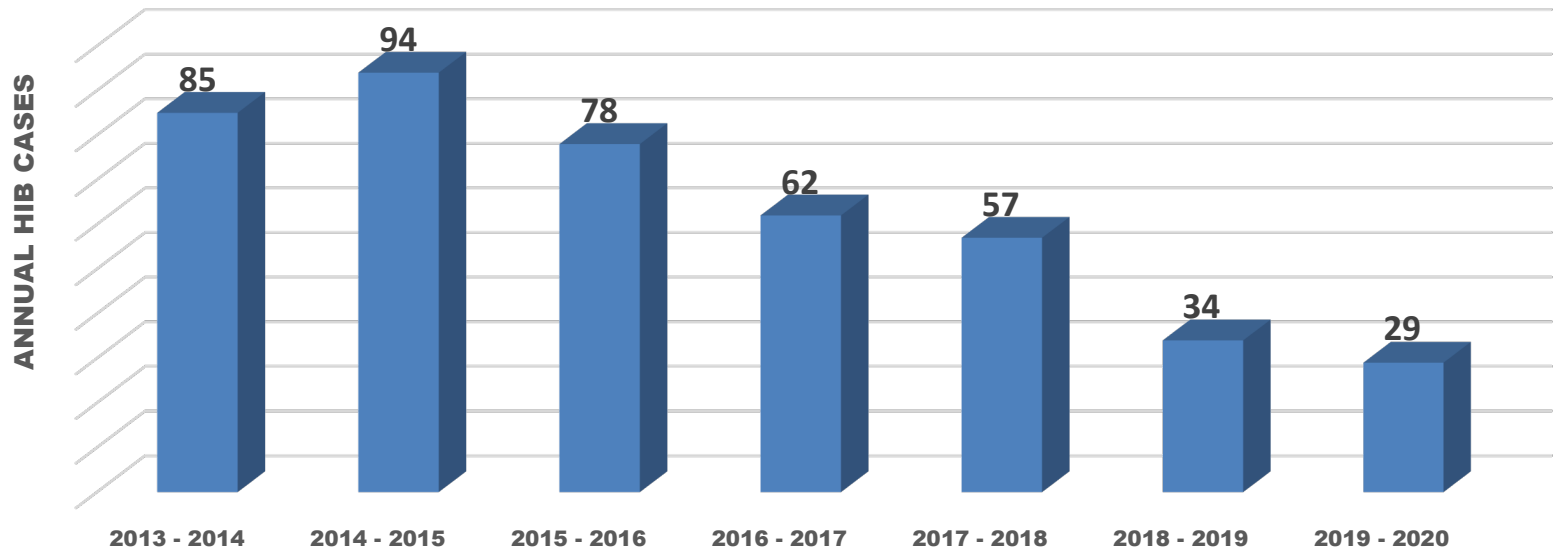
