

Early Figures Show Slight Enrollment Decrease in Jeffco

GOLDEN, Colo. (Nov. 29, 2016) – The Jeffco Public Schools 2016-17 enrollment figures show enrollment has decreased slightly since last year.

The 2016-17 membership is 86,361 students, a decrease of 370 students from the previous year. Last year saw an increase of 157 students for the school district (see chart below). These numbers include students in facilities and may be adjusted based on the outcome of review by the Colorado Department of Education.
